## **Phillip C. Chudoba**



### **Assistant Director of Intelligence Headquarters, Marine Corps**

Mr. Phillip C. Chudoba is the Assistant Director of Intelligence, Headquarters, Marine Corps. In his present position he manages the Headquarters Intelligence Divisions and provides professional intelligence management and policy support to assist the Director of Intelligence in the conduct of Marine Corps Intelligence activities within the Marine Corps, Defense, and National Intelligence Communities.

A native of New Jersey and a graduate of Rutgers University, Mr. Chudoba began his military career as a Marine Infantryman before being commissioned in May 1984.

He commanded the 3<sup>rd</sup> Force Imagery Interpretation Unit during Operations DESERT SHIELD and DESERT STORM, and later commanded the 1<sup>st</sup> Intelligence Battalion during Operation IRAQI FREEDOM. He also participated in several major Joint Task Force operations, including DELIBERATE GUARD, GUARDIAN RETRIEVAL, JOINT ENDEAVOR, and DENY FLIGHT. Mr. Chudoba has completed numerous staff intelligence assignments in the Marine Division and the Marine Air Wing. While assigned to the Deputy Directorate for Crisis Operations (J-2) at The Pentagon, he served as the Operations Officer for the National Intelligence Support Team.

Mr. Chudoba served as Director, Intelligence Integration Division, Marine Corps Combat Development Command, where he managed all Marine Corps intelligence capability requirements. Prior to assuming his current duties, Mr. Chudoba was the Program Manager for Intelligence Systems, Marine Corps Systems Command, Quantico, Virginia. He was responsible for acquisition activities covering the entire portfolio of Marine Corps intelligence capabilities. Mr. Chudoba retired from the Marine Corps at the rank of Colonel in May 2010. His personal decorations include the Bronze Star, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Navy Commendation Medal, Joint Service Achievement Medal, and Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal. Mr. Chudoba is also a recipient of the National Military Intelligence Association's John T. Hughes Award and is an All-Marine athlete.

Mr. Chudoba holds graduate degrees from US Naval Postgraduate School, Marine Corps University, and The Industrial College of the Armed Forces. He attended the School of Advanced Warfighting (SAW) and later served as the Associate Dean for Warfighting Studies at Marine Corps Command and Staff College, where he remains a member of the Adjunct Faculty.
