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## James L. Moser



### **Director OPNAV N83 Fleet Readiness**

Mr. James L. Moser is currently the Director of Fleet Readiness on the staff of the Chief of Naval Operations. Prior to this assignment, his prior Senior Executive tours were as Comptroller of Navy Systems Management Activity (NSMA), and Director of the Civilian Resources & Business Affairs Division (FMB-4), Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Navy, Financial Management and Comptroller (ASN(FM&C)).

From 2009 to 2016, he was the Deputy Director in the Operations Division in ASN(FM&C), responsible for over \$100B in annual appropriations for Navy and Marine Corps operations and military pay. In this assignment, he was responsible for creating the implementation plan for sequestration and the dramatic reductions under the Bipartisan Budget Act; oversight of aviation and ship maintenance recovery plans; and leading the financial team for addressing emergent requirements of operations in Afghanistan, Iraq, Syria and other contingencies.

In 2007, he was assigned the branch head for Aviation and Weapons Procurement in ASN(FM&C). While in this position, he was responsible for securing funding to reset aviation and ground equipment for the Navy and Marine Corps after six years of war. He also recommended and implemented a restructure of numerous unmanned aerial vehicle programs and reduced concurrence in the design and build of new helicopter and fixed wing platforms.

In 2004, he was promoted to branch head for Military Manpower, Reserves, and Operation and Maintenance, Marine Corps, in ASN(FM&C). This assignment required oversight of operation and manpower accounts during a dynamic period of war in both Iraq and Afghanistan. He oversaw the implementation of expanded benefits for military personnel, including reductions in housing out-of-pocket expenses and enhancements to the death gratuity and life insurance programs.

In 2000, James transferred to Arlington and joined the ASN(FM&C) staff in the Civilian Resources and Business Affairs Division. During his tenure in the division, he served as the lead analyst for various WCF activities, including the Naval Undersea Warfare Center, the Naval Surface Warfare Center, the Naval Shipyards, the Naval Research Lab, and SPAWAR.

He began his career with the Navy in 1996 as a Financial Management Trainee at the Space and Naval Warfare Systems Command (SPAWAR), in Arlington, Virginia. Prior to moving to San Diego as part of the Base Realignment and Closure program, he served in the Working Capital Fund (WCF) and Operations and Maintenance Divisions at SPAWAR and in the Investment Division at ASN(FM&C). While in San Diego, he completed the trainee program working in the Facilities Division at the SPAWAR Systems Center, and the Procurement and Accounting Divisions at SPAWAR headquarters.

Mr. Moser graduated from the Mount Saint Mary's College with a bachelor's of science degree in economics and mathematics and from the Naval Postgraduate School with an executive master's in business administration degree. He is a recipient of the Superior Civilian Service award and the Meritorious Civilian Service award. He is a member of the American Society of Military Comptrollers.
