ELECTRONIC SUBCONTRACTING REPORTING SYSTEM

Enclosure (1) is provided for information and action. The Director of Defense Procurement, Acquisition Policy and Strategic Sourcing (DPAPSS) has issued class deviation 2008-00004 due to DoD's phased approach for implementing the Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (eSRS). DPAPSS has provided a list of the activities that are required to implement eSRS at this time. All other activities are authorized to deviate from the current FAR provisions relating to subcontract reporting that are delineated in the class deviation. The listed FAR provisions in effect immediately prior to issuance of FAC 2005-25, effective April 22, 2008, are to be followed in lieu of the current FAR provisions.
