Jeff Bearor is Assistant Deputy Commandant for Manpower and Reserve Affairs (ADC M&RA) and assists the Deputy Commandant in the operations and management of the M&RA Department ensuring integration of all its diverse human resource functions towards accomplishment of Marine Corps missions. The M&RA Department develops policies and programs across a broad range of functions directly supporting active and reserve component Marines, their family members, and Civilian Marines.

Appointed to the Senior Executive Service in 2008, Mr. Bearor served as the Executive Deputy of the U.S. Marine Corps Training and Education Command at Quantico, Virginia. In October 2013 he was appointed as Senior Director for Security for the Department of the Navy (DON) supporting the Deputy Under Secretary of the Navy (Policy) who performs duties as the Senior Executive and Senior Agency Official for Security for the DON. In this position he acted as senior advisor to DUSN (P) on a wide variety of security policy, oversight, and resource matters.

Mr. Bearor retired from active duty in the U.S. Marine Corps after serving for more than 30 years and has over 43 years of military, joint, inter-agency and inter-governmental leadership and operational experience. He joined the USMC in 1975 following graduation from the University of Texas at Austin and was an infantry officer. He commanded four rifle companies, an infantry battalion and the Recruit Training Regiment at Parris Island, South Carolina. Mr. Bearor was a USMC exchange officer with the British Royal Marine Commandos, graduated from their famed Commando Course, and was a military diver and parachutist. He also served as a detailee in the CIA's Counter-Terrorist Center, as the Fleet Marine Officer/Force Protection Officer for the U.S. FIFTH Fleet in Manama, Bahrain, and as the Chief of Current Operations, J3 at the U.S. Central Command.

He is a graduate of the University of Texas at Austin, USMC Command and Staff College and the US Army War College.
