Megan C. Bolduc serves as the Executive Assistant Director, Directorate of Intelligence and Information Sharing (DIIS), Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS). She directs activities to provide analysis and related products to understand terror, intelligence, cyber, and criminal threats to the Department of the Navy and meet priority intelligence requirements. She also oversees the collection, analysis, exploitation, and sharing of criminal, counterintelligence, and counterterrorism information to support NCIS investigations and operations.

Ms. Bolduc was selected to the Defense Intelligence Senior Level in March 2020. She served formerly as the DIIS Deputy Assistant Director and was responsible for cyber, criminal, and field analytical teams; and the oversight of intelligence production, investigations, and operations (2018-2020). She completed previously a joint duty assignment with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Behavioral Analysis Unit, Cyber Behavioral Analysis Center (2017-2018). She served as co-lead for the new Digital Behavioral Criminalistics Cell and the team's sole Intelligence Analyst. Her former leadership positions with NCIS further include Division Chief, Strategic Planning, Communications, and Policy Directorate (2016-2017); Division Chief, Criminal Investigations and Operations Directorate (CD) (2014-2016); and Division Chief, National Security Directorate (2014-2015).

Prior to such roles, Ms. Bolduc served as a Supervisory Intelligence Specialist and Intelligence Specialist with NCIS for over ten years. She worked across NCIS mission areas while directly supporting criminal, counterterrorism, and counterintelligence investigations and operations, including positions with CD, the Global Operations Field Office, the Multiple Threat Alert Center, the Protective Operations Field Office, and the Middle East Field Office.

Ms. Bolduc earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology from the University of Virginia; a Master of Arts in Criminology and Criminal Justice from the University of Maryland, College Park; and a Master of Science in Strategic Intelligence from the National Intelligence University. She completed the Executive Certificate in Leadership Program with the University of Notre Dame, and the NAVIGATION Naval Intelligence Leadership Development Program. Her awards include the Secretary of Defense Medal for the Global War on Terrorism. She was nominated by the FBI to receive the Arthur S. Flemming Award, and twice nominated to receive the Women in Federal Law Enforcement Elizabeth Smith Friedman Intelligence Award of Excellence.
