Kimberly L. Foltz is the Deputy Counsel Naval Air Systems Command, where she is responsible for assisting the Counsel in his duties providing legal services for a command comprising more than 30,000 military and civilian personnel responsible for the technical authority, development, acquisition, and lifecycle support of all naval aircraft. As Deputy Counsel, Ms. Foltz manages a legal organization of over 120 attorneys and support staff at headquarters and in nine field offices around the country. Ms. Foltz entered the Senior Executive Service in September 2019.

From January 2016 until September 2019, Ms. Foltz was the Deputy Counsel, Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) where she assisted the Counsel in his duties as the senior legal advisor to the Chief of Civil Engineers and the NAVFAC Command. As the Deputy Counsel, Ms. Foltz managed a legal organization of over 100 attorneys and support staff located at headquarters and twelve field offices worldwide.

From 2010 to 2016 Ms. Foltz served as the Supervisory Attorney for Program Executive Office for Tactical Aircraft (PEO(T)) and the Assistant Commander for Acquisition (AIR-1.0) at the Naval Air Systems Command (NAVAIR) where she led a team of twelve attorneys providing legal and business advice to fourteen program offices supporting tactical aircraft and common systems. Ms. Foltz started her career at NAVAIR where she served as a Program Attorney supporting a number of weapons systems and platforms, including: E2-C/E2-D (Advanced Hawkeye Aircraft), Electromagnetic Aircraft Launch System and Advanced Arresting Gear (EMALS/AAG), V-22 Aircraft, Conventional Strike Weapons, Air-to-Air Missiles, Tomahawk Cruise Missile, Advanced Tactical Aircraft Protection Systems, Trainer Aircraft and Training Systems, and Airborne Electronic Attack (Next Generation Jammer). From 1991 to 1998, Ms. Foltz worked for NAVFAC, serving as an Attorney-Advisor in various offices, including: NAVFAC Northern Division, NAVFAC Headquarters, Naval Facilities Training Center Port Hueneme, California, NAVFAC Public Works Center (PWC) Norfolk and the NAVFAC Litigation Office.

A native of Pennsylvania, Ms. Foltz graduated from Millersville University of Pennsylvania in Lancaster, Pennsylvania with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration, and from the Widener University School of Law, Wilmington, Delaware, with a Juris Doctor. Ms. Foltz is a member of the Pennsylvania State Bar. Her awards include the Department of the Navy Meritorious Civilian Service Award and the Department of the Navy Superior Civilian Service Award.
