## Paul S. Landauer



### **Director, Civilian Personnel and Business Operations Division Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Navy (Financial Management and Comptroller)**

Mr. Landauer was appointed to the Senior Executive Service and selected as the Director, Civilian Personnel and Business Operations Division within the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Navy (Financial Management and Comptroller) (OASN (FM&C)) in December 2017. He leads a workforce of financial management professionals responsible for developing and implementing fiscal policy and reviewing, recommending and revising financial estimates for the Navy Working Capital Fund, civilian personnel, Information Technology, and contractor services for inclusion in the budget; to include justification of these estimates to the Congress. This equates to oversight of over \$50 billion and over 200,000 personnel. Mr. Landauer has over 16 years of service with the Department of the Navy.

Previously Mr. Landauer served as the Aviation and Weapons branch head from 2015 to 2017 and the Industrial Operations and Other Funds branch head from 2013 to 2015 within the OASN (FM&C). His responsibilities included oversight of budget formulation, justification, execution and supervision of a financial management workforce focused in the areas of Navy and Marine Corps development and procurement of aviation, weapons, ammunition, and the Navy Working Capital Funds and Trust funds.

Mr. Landauer served as the Assistant Program Manager for Finance in the COLUMBIA Class Program Office (PMS-397) within Naval Sea Systems Command from 2011 to 2013. His duties covered a broad range of business and acquisition functions, to include budgeting and execution, planning and programming, oversight of major shipbuilding design contracts with a focus on achieving cost targets.

Mr. Landauer began his federal career with the Department of the Navy as a financial management trainee in Naval Sea Systems Command. He has held several staff positions within the OASN (FM&C) covering a variety of areas including the Aviation Depot Maintenance, Flying Hours; Marine Corps Operations, Weapons Procurement, and Shipbuilding.

Mr. Landauer received his Bachelor's degree from Washington College in Maryland in Economics and Drama. He earned a Master's in Business Administration from the George Washington University. He is an active member of the Youth Apostles working with young people.

Mr. Landauer received the Meritorious Civilian Service Award in 2016 and is a graduate of the Federal Executive Institute. He holds professional membership in the American Society of Military Comptrollers and holds a Level III Certification in DoD Financial Management.
