Director of Operations Commander, Navy Installations Command

Mr. Sinder is currently serving as the Director of Operations (N3) for Commander, Navy Installations Command.

Prior to this appointment, from 2019-2020, Mr. Sinder served as the Executive Director for Commander, Naval District Washington (NDW). Principal duties included oversight and management of the +300 staff responsible for supporting Base Operations and Facility Services at 6 Navy Installation in the National Capital Region.

From 2014-2019, Mr. Sinder served as the Installation Operations and Mission Assurance Branch head on the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations (OPNAV N4) staff responsible for the policy, resourcing and oversight of the Navy's Installation Operations and Mission Assurance programs. Principle duties included supervising a team of ~40 military, civilian and contract personnel responsible for 14 Navy, Fleet Operations, Public Safety, Critical Infrastructure Protection, Cybersecurity, and Quality of Life programs.

From 2013-2014, Mr. Sinder served as the Planning and Programming Branch Head within OPNAV N4 with principle duties included supervising the programming team responsible for developing and integrating the Navy Fleet Readiness and Logistics Program Objective Memorandum, a +\$15B portfolio consisting of Navy Supply, Military Sea-Lift, Combat Logistics Force, Installations and Environmental programs.

From 2012-2013 Mr. Sinder served as the Fleet Operations Section Head. Principal duties included policy development, planning, programming, and analysis of the Navy Shore Fleet Operations and Safety and Security Programs.

From 2005-2009 as contract support and from 2009-2012 as a Navy civilian, Mr. Sinder served as the planning, programming, budget, and execution (PPBE) analyst for Commander, Navy Installations, Command (CNIC) Public Safety programs, later becoming the lead PPBE analyst for the CNIC N3 Operations directorate with principle PPBE duties that included the

development of required programming, budget, and execution deliverables for Fleet Operations and Safety and Security programs.

From 2003-2005, Mr. Sinder began his career with Battelle Memorial Institute working in the National Security Division in a research and support capacity on a variety of government support contracts to include Army & Navy CBRNE systems, Navy Anti-terrorism/Force protection, and Navy Shipboard Collective Protection systems.
