Director, Program/Budget Coordination Division Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Navy (Financial Management and Comptroller)

Ms. St. Andre assumed her duties as Director of the Program/Budget Coordination Division on 13 November, 2017. She is responsible for implementing overall budget strategies; promulgating budget formulation guidance; developing Navy, Marine Corps, and Secretariat procedures for the Departmental resource decision-making process; monitoring and continuously evaluating budget execution performance; processing fund allocations for the entire Department of the Navy; establishing budget controls; and development and operation of IT systems in support of the budget process.

Ms. St. Andre entered the Senior Executive Service in June 2015 with her initial assignment as the Deputy Chief, Business Operations/Comptroller at the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery (BUMED). In this position, she served as the chief financial executive for Navy Medicine and as resource advisor to the Chief, BUMED. She was responsible for establishing policy and managing financial and manpower resources for a medical activity totaling more than \$6 billion per year in operating costs. She also led the planning, programming, and budgeting process throughout Navy Medicine, interfacing directly with both Navy and Office of the Secretary of Defense counterparts.

Prior to joining the Senior Executive Service, Ms. St. Andre served as the Branch Head for Readiness Programs in the Department of the Navy Office of the Assistant Secretary (Financial Management and Comptroller) Operations Division (FMB1). Her responsibilities included oversight of the Department of the Navy Budget formulation and execution of the O&M accounts for Air Operations, Aircraft Maintenance and Operations Support, Ship Maintenance, Ship Operations and Support, and Base Operations/SRM totaling \$28 billion. From 2009-2014, Ms. St. Andre was the Branch Head for Construction, C4I, and RDT&E in the Investment and Development Division (FMB2). Her responsibilities included oversight of the Department of the Navy Budget formulation and execution of all RDT&E, OPN, C4I, and MILCON programs.

Ms. St. Andre has also served as the Congressional Support Branch Head in the Department of the Navy Appropriations Matters Office (FMBE) from 2003-2008. Her responsibilities included maintaining liaison with the Congressional Appropriations Committees, the Office of Legislative Affairs, and the Congressional Liaison Offices of

the Secretary of Defense for appropriations matters related to Congressional hearings and Congressional staff members for all oversight committees. She was responsible for coordinating all matters related to Department of the Navy (DoN) participation in hearings before the Appropriations Committees. In this capacity, she prepared the Secretary of the Navy, Chief of Naval Operations, and Commandant of the Marine Corps for DoN posture hearing testimony. She also coordinated the preparation of the Department of the Navy appeals to proposed budget adjustments by the Appropriations and Armed Services Committees.

Ms. St. Andre graduated Summa Cum Laude and Phi Beta Kappa from Bowdoin College with a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics and Spanish and holds a Master of Public Administration degree from American University where she was inducted into the Pi Alpha Alpha National Honor Society for Public Affairs and Administration. She also is a graduate of the Secretary of the Navy Civilian Fellowship Program in Financial Management.

Ms. St. Andre entered the Federal Government in 1992 as a Navy Centralized Financial Management Trainee at the National Naval Medical Center. Her duties included being the Budget Analyst for several medical directorates while completing rotational assignments at OASD (HA) and NAVCOMPT. Upon completing the two-year training program, she became a Senior Budget Analyst at BUMED and later served as the Deputy Director for the Program Analysis and Evaluation (PA&E) division at BUMED.

Ms. St. Andre is a two time recipient of the Department of the Navy Meritorious Civilian Service Award. She is also a member of the American Society of Military Comptrollers.
